

ALACE submits pay claim for 2021 onwards

The Association of Local Authority Chief Executives and Senior Managers has submitted a pay claim for staff covered by the Joint Negotiating Committee for Chief Executives of Local Authorities.

ALACE is seeking a pay increase for all chief executives in April 2021 and subsequent years that is the same as the generality of local government staff.

Tracey Lee, the chair of ALACE, said "Local authority chief executives hold among the most demanding and challenging roles in public sector leadership, and this has been fully underlined by the contribution that they have made during the COVID pandemic, at national, regional and local level. Their work needs to be fairly rewarded. We do not seek special treatment for our chief executive members. We ask only that they receive the same pay increase as the Local Government Employers negotiate for the generality of local government staff."

"We look forward to receiving the Employers' response in due course."
